What is the Clean Energy Collaborative?

The Clean Energy Collaborative is officially known as the Demand-Side Management / Renewable Energy Collaborative. It was established in the 2010 settlement agreement that stopped a coal-coal burning power plant proposed by the East Kentucky Power Cooperative.

Goals of the Collaborative:

The charter that established the Collaborative states as its goals: "to evaluate and recommend actions [to EKPC] to expand deployment of renewable energy and demand-side management, and to promote collaboration among the Parties in the implementation of those ideas."

Timeline & Meetings

The Collaborative began in the spring of 2011 and will last for two years, with quarterly meetings open to the public. The remaining meetings will be held on:
